All changes must be reviewed and approved by the IRB prior to implementation. Failure to obtain prior approval could result in suspension of the study and additional action as necessary.

Unanticipated Problems and Study Deviations: Protocol deviations, unanticipated problems, adverse events, subject

complaints, or other problems that may affect the risk to participants, must promptly be reported to the IRB.

- An unanticipated problem is any problem or event which was unanticipated, reflects new or increased risk to the subjects, and was possibly related to the research procedures.
- A study deviation is any change in the study protocol that was not previously approved by the IRB Committee.

Recordkeeping: As the PI, you have the responsibility to maintain accurate record keeping of all study related documents, correspondence, and files.

All researchers are required to always follow the American Psychological Association's ethical principles and code of conduct, especially in regards to Section 8 of the ethical code "research and publication." Failure to conform to the APA ethical code may result in revocation of IRB approval.
